HOW RENTAL ASSISTANCE CAN HELP YOU

The State of Oklahoma and Tulsa County are using CARES Act funds to help tenants pay their rent. Here's how applying for rental assistance can help you:

Applying for rental assistance can help you pay back rent: Rent has not been cancelled, even if you cannot be evicted due to an eviction moratorium. That means you will still owe any missed payments. Rental assistance can pay your landlord what you owe.

Applying for rental assistance can help ease your financial burden so you can afford other necessities, like food and medicine: Even before the COVID-19 pandemic, many Tulsans were cost-burdened and spent a significant amount of their income on housing costs. Now, many tenants are forced to choose between paying their rent and buying necessities. Rental assistance can help you with your housing costs so you don't have to choose between rent and other bills.

Applying for rental assistance can help you qualify for protection under the Center for Disease Control's eviction moratorium: The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) has temporarily halted evictions of covered tenants for non-payment of rent through December 31, 2020. To qualify, tenants must make their best effort to apply for available housing and rental assistance. Applying for Oklahoma and Tulsa County rental assistance will help you qualify for protection from eviction under the CDC eviction moratorium.
